RUE seeks to ensure that the money spent on Road User/Safety education nationally is used effectively and achieves the maximum impact in the education of young people about the responsibilities associated with road use.

In addition to work around road user education, RUE also provides services to a variety of social and youth work agencies including approving and reviewing foster carers; Youth Service Ofsted preparation; general training; external supervision; preparing project feasibility studies and support to voluntary youth work organisations.

LINKS Citizenship Pack Training

Now you have the LINKS Pack why not consider getting some training on how to get the best from it?

RUE has developed an accompanying training day that provides you with an opportunity to test out the Pack before you use it with young people.

The standard day looks like this:

Aim of session

To provide a comprehensive introduction into the use of the LINKS Citizenship Pack.

Duration

Usually one full day (9.30 to 3.30)

Number of places available

Up to 20

Location

If a group booking, the training can be provided at a venue convenient to your school, college or project.

Other sessions providing individual places will be held at locations around the country and will be organised in response to demand.

Contents

To:

- consider what is Road User Education and how can it be integrated into work with young people;
- consider the LINK between Citizenship and Road User Education;
- introduce the LINKS pack, including how to use it, what additional resources can be developed/employed and preparing an action plan for implementation back at your school, college or project;
- explore our own motivations regarding road use and learn from others in the group.

Style of delivery

an interactive day using a mixture of presentation and small group work activities to: improve your knowledge base; encourage the investigation of relevant issues and disseminate examples of emerging good practice.



Outcomes

You will leave at the end of the day having:

- spent quality time with fellow professionals working with young people, under experienced leadership;
- considered the tool kit of practical ideas and information;
- considered an action plan for implementation;
- gained the confidence to put things into action back in their own education settings.



In addition to these specific outcomes consultation will take place regarding future training needs surrounding this issue.

Teachers and others responsible for work around Citizenship and road user education.
